AIMS

1: TIME TO TALK

Be a lead organisation and service provider for adult female survivors to address the entrenched trauma of childhood sexual abuse

2: BE PART OF THE CHANGE

Expose domestic and family violence links to child sexual abuse, particularly coercive control

SHIFT THE SHAME

Challenge patriarchal narrative which objectifies girls and women and attributes shame to perpetrator rather than victim

3: STRENGTHEN

Stepping Out as a service

OBJECTIVES

1.1 Deliver, monitor and evaluate programs which meet survivors where they are at, including psychoeducation, social inclusion and peer support

1.2 Expand the suite of evidence-based programs and reach of service, particularly work within the domestic and family violence sector

1.3 Provide CSA training and professional education programs

2.1 Build partnerships with women's services, relevant government and community agencies and the wider community. Seek to partner with a research organisation to build the evidence basis

2.2 Advocate to government through policy and other submissions

2.3 Raise awareness and reduce stigma through social media campaigns

3.1 Community collaboration and partnerships

3.2 Diversify funding and program opportunities

3.3 Review all organisational, governance and operational structures to ensure fit for purpose

3.4 Lived experience advisory committee to contribute to programs and policies
